Preparing Household Garbage

Residents' Garbage Cans

Residents not living in areas that have automated pick-up may utilize bags or cans.

- Place only bagged household garbage in cans - no tiles, concrete or bricks.
- Close the lids securely.
- Place cans at the road edge with 3' clearance around any obstacles such as mailboxes, cars, or recycling bins.
- Set out the night before or by 6 am on pick-up day.



City Issued Garbage Carts

Residents with automated pick-up receive city-issued carts.

Follow the above guidelines with the following exceptions:

- Place the cart at the edge of the road with the wheels facing the house.
- Keep lid closed and avoid overloading.
- Residents are responsible for any garbage that falls out.
- Excess bags beside the cart will not be collected.



Preparing Bulk Trash & Vegetation

- Bulk trash, such as furniture, appliances, mattresses and vegetation is limited to three (3) cubic yards.
- Construction and demolition debris, such as fencing, cabinets, carpeting, and tile, is limited to one (1) cubic yard.
- All bulk/vegetation/construction debris is picked up weekly and placed at the curb the night before or by 6am the day of pickup.
- Leave 3' around each pile and any obstructions, such as mailboxes, cars, trees or recycling bins.
- Break, bag and box items with glass or mirror.
- Take lids off paint cans and allow paint to dry.
- Bag loose or small debris.
- Large tree stumps and trunks (larger than 4" in diameter) require a special pick-up.
- Vegetation must be cut into 4' lengths.
- Place grass clippings, leaves, coconuts, and loose yard waste in heavy-duty plastic trash bags or separate containers.
- Separate bulk/construction/vegetation for pick-up.
- Hot tubs must be cut into 4 sections and place one section (1) per pick-up day.

Preparing Recyclables

Weekly residential curbside recycling is provided at no additional cost. Please do not place electronics, plastic grocery bags or styrofoam in the recycling containers.

Yellow Bin: Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogs, Mail, Boxes (Cut into 3'x3' sections)



Blue Bin: Steel cans, Aluminum Cans, Bottles/Jars, Drink Boxes, Milk Cartons, All plastic Containers (#1-7)



Please note that recycling carts are not provided & can be purchased at a local home improvement store.

Tires

FREE PICK-UP ON TIRE AMNESTY WEEK:

June 1 – 5, 2026 &

November 30 – Dec 4, 2026

- Place up to (8) car/truck tires (with/out rims) at the curb for pickup on the scheduled bulk trash day.
- Set tires at the road's edge the night before or by 6am on the day of pickup.
- Leave 3' around any obstructions, such as mailboxes, cars, or recycle bins.
- Keep tires separated from other bulk or trash piles.
- Missed Amnesty Days? Call for special pickup

Special Pick-Up & Bagster Guidelines

Vegetation over three (3) cubic yards or construction debris over one (1) cubic yard (brick, concrete, wood, pallets, cabinets, fencing, carpeting, tile) can be disposed of using a bagster (purchase from local home improvement stores) and scheduling a special pick-up via the City's mobile app.

Hazardous Waste & Pills

Needles, medical waste, A/C units, electronics, fluorescent bulbs, motor oil, antifreeze, wet paint or chemicals should be taken to a transfer station.

- For pill drop off locations, call 561-681-4460 or visit boynton-beach.org/garbage.

Violation(s) Information

Because it requires additional staff and resources, there is a charge for these violations:

- Garbage, recyclables, bulk/trash/vegetation placed prior to scheduled pick-up day.
- Trash piles that have mixed debris, such as vegetation on top of a construction pile.
- Vegetation piles over three (3) cubic yards.
- Construction debris over one (1) cubic yard.
- Loose household garbage or small bulk trash not bagged or containerized.

A door hanger will be left explaining the nature of the violation and the necessary steps to resolve it.

A mandatory service charge applies to oversized or improperly placed bulk, trash, vegetation, or garbage carts left at the curb.



If you live outside City limits but have City water service, call the Solid Waste Authority at 561-640-4000 for trash and recycling collection.

For flooding, sewer, stormwater, lift stations, or sinkholes, call 561-742-6400.



For upcoming street repaving in your area, call 561-742-6200, option 2 to coordinate refuse services.

Hurricane Prep

Hurricane season begins on June 1. All major trimmings should be completed prior to this date.

Once a storm watch or warning has been issued, do not trim vegetation of any kind.

Once a storm has been named:

- **Do not cut down trees or do major yard work.**
- **Do not begin construction projects that produce debris.**
